SPH Budget Model (Instituted Fiscal Year 2012)

Principles

- Divisions and School have a shared responsibility for ICR and tuition estimates including any ICR/tuition surplus and/or deficit.
- University cost pools responsibility stays at the school level.
- Cost pool coverage state funds, ICR, and tuition.
- Division allocations consists solely of tuition and ICR.



SPH Budget Model Process

- Budget Development: Divisions develop the future ICR and Tuition targets in consultation with the School.
- School & Division Allocations
 - The ICR and Tuition targets along with state funding, cost pool charges and SWU costs are used to determine the allocations to the divisions.
- Fiscal Year End: The school is required to reconcile the ICR and Tuition targets. School and Divisions share in the responsibility of any ICR/Tuition deficits and/or surpluses.



SPH Budget Model (Instituted Fiscal Year 2012)

<u>University Allocation</u>	SPH	Other UofM School Course
SPH student taking SPH course	100% Allocated to SPH	
SPH student taking Other UofM School course	25% Allocated to SPH	75% Allocated to Other UofM School
Non-SPH student taking a SPH course	75% Allocated to SPH	25% Allocated to Other UofM School

Allocation within SPH (Example EpiCH Student)	EpiCH	Other Division (Bio, EnHS, or HPM)
EpiCH student taking an EpiCH course	100% allocated to EpiCH	
EpiCH student taking an Other Division course	75% allocated to Other Division	25% allocated to EpiCH
Other Division Student taking an EpiCH course	75% allocated to EpiCH	25% allocated to other division
